City of Corpus Christi Commission on Children and Youth commissioned Dr. Philip Rhoades with the Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi to complete the **2009 & 2013 Data Collection Projects**.

The study provides demographic and statistical information on issues that impact the health and well-being of our youth and families. The risk factors analyzed in Nueces County include:



- Socio-economic Status of Families
- Family Management Stressors
- Reported Cases of Teen Pregnancy and STDs
- Youth Alcohol and Drug Use Facts
- Adult Alcohol and Drug Use Facts
- Education Statistics
- Economic & Housing Statistics

These reports and statistics can be used when seeking grant funds for programs, justification for partnerships among social service entities, and to monitor our progress and effectiveness in addressing these issues as a community.
